- You are encouraged to connect with the person that God has placed on your heart.
- When the nominating period is over the Discernment Team will take some time to prayerfully consider the nominees, and will make a recommendation to the Lead Team.
- The Lead Team will review the nominees and present the prospective Lead Team members to the participating members of the Covenant Community for affirmation at the annual meeting.

A Lead Team Member has a term of 3 years. The roles and qualifications of the Lead Team are listed on the back of this form. You are also encouraged to ask any member of the Lead Team if you need more information on what they do.
